

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

“This looks like a church that does missions!” - a quote from Pastor Lubin when he walked into First Baptist to pick up another 100 lbs. of food we are sending to Haiti and saw 66 duffle bags filled with medicines and clothing ready to go to the Dominican Republic.

Indeed it is! We really switch gears in July and August. During these summer months, there is no Sunday School (we give our teachers a rest!); most of our regularly scheduled team meetings are on hold until September; our choir gets a break for the summer, so Wednesday night choir practices stop for a few weeks. Generally speaking, things are simply quieter around here in July and August.

But don't think we've gone to sleep! Quite the opposite! Wallingford First Baptist is more active than ever. We are actively engaged in the mission of Christ outside the four walls of the Church.

The DR Mission: On June 27 we will send a group of 70 people to the **Dominican Republic** for nine days to minister among the very poor immigrant Haitian sugar cane cutters. Some will engage in construction as they work on the second and third floors of the Good Samaritan Hospital which now ministers to over 60,000 people a year. Six nurses and support staff will work with Dominican doctors and nurses as they go out into the sugar cane Bateys (villages) to bring medicine to the sick. A children's teaching team will work with children all week in something similar to our Vacation Bible School. Pastor Lubin and I will engage in some of the most effective evangelism I have ever seen. Typically, over 200 people pray each year to receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Thanks to Tom, our in-resident professional welder, new forms for our water filter project will be built. These filters have the potential of saving hundreds of lives. What a great project!!!

Last year, Pastor Lubin and I began a leadership training seminar for Sunday School Teachers, Deacons, and Pastors. We will be leading this seminar once again. This year, we will focus on Understanding the Gospel of Mark. Several churches will be sending leaders. Last year, we had nearly 75 people come to our seminar who seemed very grateful for the helpful new and exciting insight regarding the Gospel of John.

Please pray for me as I preach on Sunday morning and Sunday night. I do this so our English-speaking team members understand what is going on. Pastor Lubin graciously translates in Haitian Creole for me as I teach and preach. It is always a challenge to take the Word of God and apply it to the lives of those living in a very different culture than our own.

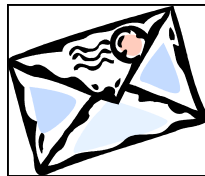

The DR Mission Team will be bringing 70 people to La Romana, DR from June 27 - July 5 to bring help, hope, and Christ's love to the very poor. Our group will have several construction teams at the Good Samaritan Hospital and in the bateyes, will continue work on the bio sand water filter project, will conduct daily medical clinics in the sugar cane villages, will share the Gospel with those who do not know Him, and will provide educational activities for dozens of children. In addition, the group will hand-carry close to 3,000 pounds of donated medicine, clothing, shoes, school supplies, tools, and even baseball equipment!

There will be much fun and laughter as the people of God work together and enjoy the sense of teamwork! If you have never been on a mission team, this is a good experience to see what it's like, July 28 – August 1.

VBS: Then comes Vacation Bible School! It promises to be a wonderful week with dozens and dozens of children and volunteers filling every room and every space at First Baptist with excitement and joyful learning. We are working with White Oak Baptist and Liberty Community Church this year. When the creative volunteers from each church get together to plan and work together for Christ, it is a truly awesome experience. So, plan on being available August 4-8 to help out. If you are so unfortunate as not to be able to volunteer this year, then please keep VBS in your prayers!

The Haiti Mission: Finally, I am blessed to be able to go to Haiti again this year. I will be joining Pastor Lubin Beaucejour, Pastor Dave Strosahl, and Pastor Mark Angerosa. The first three days (August 12-14) we will be teaching at a Pastors' Conference. The last three days (August 15-17) we will be preaching at the Grand Convention of the Bethesda Evangelical Mission which will be attended by hundreds of people from all across Southern Haiti. Messages of encouragement and hope in the Lord will be broadcast by way of TV and radio. Haiti needs hope!

For those of you who have been concerned about the safety issues of traveling to Haiti, the good news is that things have calmed down politically. There are no more protests against the government and no more rioting in the streets. The bad news is that grueling poverty continues, with gasoline at \$35 a gallon, and food costs are prohibitive. In the midst of this sadness, the theme of the convention is: “Come and See the Wonders of the Lord!” (Psalm 46:8). It is extremely important for us to go preaching, teaching, and encouraging the saints. The Christians need to be encouraged and supported by our love. We will be bringing spiritual food and money for physical food for the attendees to eat. Please pray that we will be able to raise all the money we need to make this one of the best conventions ever.

Thanks for your prayers for this incredibly wonderful summer of Christian outreach in the marvelous name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. For those of you who are volunteering – thank you!!! For those of you who are remembering us in your prayers – **thank you! Thank you!**
