Bio for Reverend Bruce Sandy

I grew up in Oxford, Massachusetts (MA), attending an American Baptist Church where I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior at age 10. I graduated from University of MA cum laude with three majors: Psychology, History, and Social Sciences along with teacher's certification.

I attended Gordon-Conwell and Andover-Newton seminaries, receiving a Master of Divinity cum laude in 1980. In 1977, I was an Assistant Minister at an American Baptist Church in Lynn, MA, when Pastor Bill was the Pastor at an ABC church in neighboring Peabody. We have developed a lasting friendship throughout the years. On a few occasions, he and I combined our youth groups for fun activities. We have stayed in touch ever since.

I pastored a church in Somerville, MA, in the midst of a tough section of the inner city. It was here that I learned it is not the size of your congregation that determines your ministries but the size of your parishioners' faith. They had an incredible faith! After six years there, I moved on to FBC in Belmont, MA, a fairly wealthy suburban community whose residents had the oldest average age in all of Massachusetts, which made for very interesting ministries. Eleven years later, I came to Manchester, CT, and have been serving the Lord there for the last 12 years. And yes, I am still a die-hard fan of the Red Sox, otherwise know as an eternal optimist!

My wife Bettylou and I have been married for eight years now. A couple of years ago, we bought our first home together. It's a beautiful ranch backing up to a nature preserve. Bettylou has an adult daughter that lives in the Boston area. Bettylou is a professional gardener, teaching numerous courses at Manchester Community College, as well as training people how to garden for themselves, reconnecting them to God's creation.

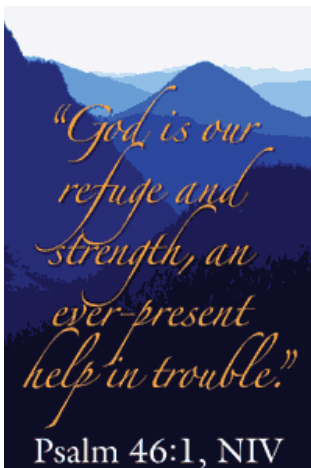

B.E.M. Annual Pastor's Conference and Convention

This August (9-16), many area pastors will travel to LesCayes, Haiti for this year's Annual Conference and Convention. Unlike conferences here in the states, that which goes on "down there" is slightly different.

Pastors in Southern Haiti will travel many days to get to the city of LesCayes. Some of the pastors come from remote areas in the hill country, many miles from the city. They will start on the back of a donkey or by foot until they get down to a road. They will then get a ride in the back of a pickup truck or walk as many miles as it takes to get LesCayes.

Once there, the pastors will be given a place to sleep in the school (on the floor) we have helped build, next to the church in LesCayes. When they have settled in, they will have three days of intense Biblical training, led by Pastors Bill Huegel, Dave Strosahl, and Mark Angerosa. These days are followed by three more days of the Annual Convention of the Bethesda Evangelical Mission. Pastors and delegates from all over Southern Haiti will have three days of preaching and joyous worship, which will be broadcast all over Haiti and the surrounding islands via radio and TV. This is such a powerful witness to those struggling with the rigors of daily life in this depressed area!

The pastors (and many of the delegates) in this poor country have to be fed for this week of meetings. The costs of broadcasting these services are significant. This is a huge undertaking for the local church. **If you are so moved to contribute to this ongoing ministry or want further information on it, please contact Pastor Lubin or myself.** Checks may be made out to B.E.M. (convention-conference).

Your continued prayers for the people of Haiti and the work of B.E.M. are always very much appreciated.
