Jean Lubin Beaucejour is the USA Director for Bethesda Evangelical Mission (BEM) since 1991 and a philanthropist born and raised in Les Cayes, Haiti. He is a graduate of the Institute Biblique Emmanuel in Leogane, Haiti, and has a BA in Journalism from the Association of Journalists of Haiti. He is a Pastor and community organizer who believes in listening to the needs of the people and through his counseling, providing hope to the less fortunate in Haiti. He has ministered in an apostolic role in many other countries as well, such as the Dominican Republic, Bolivia, Columbia, and many states throughout the United States. He travelled and learned in several Middle East countries, such as Israel, Aman and Qatar. Additionally, he assisted in the transitions at White Oak Baptist Church.

In the mid 1980s, Pastor Lubin was a journalist in Haiti and anchored a TV news show called “Your Ideas, Friends”. He used his microphone to give a voice to the voice-less and focused on issues such as necessity of education, self -empowerment and a way to make the impossible become possible. He invited many politically influential people to his show to discuss difficult topics and answer the audience’s questions.

At the same time, Pastor Lubin and his brother started the Bethesda Evangelical Mission (BEM) in their mother’s living room. The goal of BEM was to preach the gospel, educate youth, and feed the hungry. Many came to know the Lord and as a result today, this ministry is now a network of 60 congregations as well as 12 schools and 2 orphanages in the southern peninsula of Haiti.

In 1991, he came to the United States and worked for many companies including Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield, and the United States Postal Service. Soon after, he started the US branch of BEM in Connecticut. The focus was to bring people from the US to Haiti to help those who had such great need. This was accomplished through evangelism, providing medical care to those who could not access health care, wells to provide clean water, training leaders to better serve their community, building schools and community centers, and to bring freedom to the Restavec slave children of Haiti.

Currently Pastor Lubin and his ministry is building a hospital in Les Cayes with the focus on his greatest passion; to provide high quality, affordable healthcare for the people of Haiti who have been neglected access to basic medical care. The mission also oversees sixty Pastors in southern Haiti.
